International Cancer Screening Network (ICSN)

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Background & History

- Established (1988) as the International Breast
 Cancer Screening Database Project
 - Conceptualized by Professor Sam Shapiro
 - Purpose: generate a common database for the evaluation of screening mammography programs
 - 'Provide a mechanism to compare data from population-based screening programs, to facilitate the most effective and efficient contribution of screening to breast cancer control worldwide'
 - Representatives from 11 countries began participating in a series of meetings

Background & History (2)

- Purpose revised (1997): foster collaborative efforts aimed at -
 - Using and comparing data from screening mammography programs internationally
 - Developing methods for evaluating the impact of population-based screening mammography programs
- Name changed (1997) to the International Breast Cancer Screening Network (IBSN)
- Network expanded to include 27 countries
- Each country has 1 representative

Background & History (3)

- 2004 Biennial Meeting, Oslo, Norway:
 - Meeting agenda included sessions on colorectal and cervical cancer surveillance
- 2006 Biennial Meeting, Ottawa, Canada:
 - Country representatives voted to expand the network to include 3 evidence-based types of cancer screening: Breast, Colorectal, Cervical
 - 2nd name change: International Cancer Screening Network (ICSN)
 - Purpose unchanged


Working Groups (3)
